

The Queensland Association for Healthy Communities is pleased to launch the Queensland Pride Short Film Competition as part of the Tropical Alternative Film Festival (TAFF). The Queensland Pride Short Film Competition is now open for submissions until February the 17th 2010. Winning entries will be screened in April and May of 2010 at the Tropical Alternative Film Festival (TAFF) in regional Queensland communities. The competition is open to innovative, entertaining, intelligent and celebratory short films. Fabulous films which uplift and inspire are especially welcome.

Writing Themselves In 3: Third Australian Survey of Young People who are Same Sex Attracted



Who pushes your buttons?

Are you attracted to people of the same sex? Aged between 14 and 21 years? Living in Australia? Interested in having a say about the issues affecting your life?

If you have sexual feelings for people of the same sex, whether or not you have ever acted on those feelings, we are interested in finding out about you, your family and friends, school, relationships, how people treat you, sexual health and the fun things about your life. The results of this research will be used to improve education and services and focus more attention on how to make Australia a more inclusive place regarding sexual diversity.

Or do you work with same-sex attracted kids aged 14-21 in Australia? Encourage them to write themselves in to Australian history by filling out the third national Australian survey on same-sex attracted youth at www.wti3.org.au!

This is the 3rd national Writing Themselves In questionnaire. It has been put together by a team of researchers from the Australian Research Centre in Sex Health and Society (La Trobe University), Melbourne, with the help of a number of young people and youth workers from a range of different organisations. Gay Men's Health Retreat

QAHC will be holding a health retreat for gay men on Magnetic Island in April. We've booked the whole of the Arcadia Beach Guesthouse to give us a private space to unwind, explore some of the health issues specific to gay men in a safe environment, enjoy good food and make friends with other gay men from the area. During the retreat we'll have time to explore some issues important to gay men; **Relationships**, **Cruising** and **Sexual Pleasure**. The retreat will run from the late afternoon of Friday 16th April to the afternoon of Sunday 18th. Cost is \$100 per person (\$80 concession) and includes accommodation for the two nights and all food and activities. Participants will have to organise their own travel to and from the island. The guesthouse has a number of rooms with differing levels of comfort but the focus of this retreat is on developing new skills, knowledge and relationships so all participants pay the same amount, with beds allocated by lottery (couples will have priority for double beds) prior to arrival.

Work, Love, Play Survey

Work, Love, Play is a study of families parented by same-sex attracted parents (couples and sole-parents), the full title of which is "Work, Love, Play: Understanding Resilience in Same-Sex Parented Families".

The Work, Love, Play study is seeking more GLBTI parents to be part of the study. In the first survey, over 350 people stated they were happy for the researchers to invite them to be part of future studies. This was a fantastic response. However, some groups are currently underrepresented in the study and the researchers would like to boost numbers in these areas if possible.

Not surprisingly, the majority of responses were from lesbians who live in inner-city areas. Victoria, QLD and NSW were also well represented. People the study would like to hear more from are:

- gay dads of all descriptions
- men and women who live in rural and regional areas
- men and women who live in the Northern Territory, Western Australia, South Australia or the ACT
- gay dads from Tasmania
- gay dads from New Zealand
